We are looking for a *very* part-time (4.5 – 7.5 hours per month) Support Network Facilitator for a new Network to recruit, motivate and support a small group of volunteers as they develop and maintain relationships with the person with developmental disabilities at the centre of the network.

- Liaise and support the individual and their family in nurturing these friendships
- Organize and chair network meetings several times per year, write monthly reports
- Attend monthly meeting with other Network Facilitators
- Establish network plans and review as needed
- Maintain regular contact with the Networks Program Manager and to be part of the vibrant Lifetime Networks Team.
