Key Responsibilities:

- Provide one to one support to a child with a disability at summer camp
- Work as a team with other Summer Inclusion Support Worker and camp leaders to create inclusive camp experiences

Hours and Compensation:

- 37.5 hours/week.
- \$19.71/hour plus 4% vacation pay.
- Anticipated dates June 14th- September 3rd, 2021. Must be available to work ALL weeks.

Responsibilities Include:

- Evaluate the leisure and recreation needs of participants and the assistance they require in order to participate in community leisure and recreation opportunities.
- Assist children and youth with disabilities, while they pursue their leisure and recreation interests (including assisting with all aspects of the participant's personal care needs if required).
- Encourage relationship building by facilitating the inclusion of the participant with their non-disabled peers.
- Utilize a collaborative approach towards inclusion by consulting with appropriate parties (the family, the program leaders and staff, the Summer Inclusion Service Coordinator).
- Perform duties in accordance with the approved policies and procedures of Lifetime Networks.
- Complete required paperwork pertaining to the support of the participant pre and post support in a timely manner.



- Facilitate positive social interaction and relationship building of participant and fellow program campers.
